11:15 - 12:15	 Exploitation and Sustainability Plan The consortium members will sign an Intellectual Property Right Agreement, which will regulate the shared property of the results and will be attached to a comprehensive exploitation plan. P1 the coordinator will take care of the expenses to maintain the website and platform online after the end of the project. As for the resources, the partners plan to invest mostly human resources in the sustainability activities: each organization will offer support services to interested stakeholders as during the project lifespan. Consortium has agreed on sponsorship measures for the platform and all the tools, they will look for sponsors in order to sustain maintenance features so that all contents and tools will be available for all. The exploitation plan will be developed by P3 EUROGEO. P3 will be supported by the entire partnership, giving its qualified contribution. To guarantee a high level of exploitation, partners will: Attend sector-specific conferences where the project can be disseminated (ex. European Annual conference of the EU digital learning network, European Learning & Teaching Forum by the European Association, ERACON Congress organised by European Erasmus Coordinators' Network hosting every year some 400 representative etc.) Set up of a "digital readiness observatory" to lobby on public institutions for the adoption of project outcomes as best practice Two main steps are envisaged to devise the ONLIFE strategy for sustainability: 1) First, an analysis of quality criteria for defining best tailored exploitation practices for the project's tangible results: this analysis will be carried out from the beginning and will be given a boost in last phase, to also taking into account the assessment of results. Then P3 will elaborate the exploitation plan describing the actions to follow for the sustainability of results.
